

## Destinations report 2024 leavers

**60 (not including 2 pupils who have remained at Pilgrim) School leavers**

### Notes

(Details below of individual pupils)

- 87% of pupils have a secured destination within an educational setting this is up by 1% on last academic year.
- 2 less pupil's are NEET than the previous year (not including the pupil pending) with the percentage of pupils who are NEET for this year being 11%.
- 5 of the 8 pupils who are NEET have an EHCP, 1 of which is pending a placement.
- 1 out of the 8 NEET is taking a year out to focus on their Physical health.
- 1 out of the 8 NEET is taking time out due to parental terminal illness.
- The other pupil registered as NEET was due to attend a provision however was unable to attend after an escalation to Child Protection and the family being placed into temporary emergency accommodation.
- 23 out of 28 (82%) pupils with an EHCP have a confirmed placement.
- There does not appear to be a direct correlation between length of time pupils have been at Pilgrim and successful transition:

Of the 5 pupils who have gone on to complete A-Levels 2 of them attended Pilgrim in KS3 (1 was receiving pastoral only support and 1 was home taught), 1 started in year 10 (base taught), and 2 started while in year 11 (1 home taught and 1 base taught).

23 of the 52 pupils who secured a placement attended Pilgrim in KS3.

7 of the 52 pupils who secured a placement began Pilgrim in year 10.

21 of the 52 pupils who secured a placement started at Pilgrim in year 11.

This is the same pattern for NEET with there being a similar number of pupils NEET that started prior to year KS3 (4 with 1 pending, 3 of which are SEND) than starting in year 11 (3 with 2 being SEND).

- There has been a decrease in the number of pupils accessing a level 2 qualification or higher at 38% (23 of 60) for this year and 47% last year (22 of 46). This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> year for a slight decrease.
- One pupil took up apprenticeship opportunity this year which is one more than last year and back to the same number for the year prior.
- No pupils went on to employment which was the same as last year.
- There is one pupil this year who was granted online learning opportunities funded by the local authority for their SEND needs.

#### Key Group Breakdown

- Home Pupils = 20 of the 60 pupils are home taught (33%)
  - 25% of these have gone on to complete a level 2 or above level of qualification.
  - 55% of these have gone on to complete a level 1 or below level of qualification.
  - 20% of these are NEET.
- Base Pupils – 33 of the 60 pupils are base taught (55%)
  - 42% of these have gone on to complete a level 2 or above level of qualification.
  - 48% of these have gone on to complete a level 1 or below level of qualification.
  - 9% of these are NEET.
- Blended Pupils – 7 of the 60 pupils were blended with a mix of both home and base education (11%)
  - 42% of these have gone on to complete a level 2 or above level of qualification.
  - 42% of these have gone on to complete a level 1 or below level of qualification.
  - 14% of these are NEET.
- EHCP – 27 of the 60 pupils have an EHCP (45%)
  - 25 % of these were home taught – 14% of this went on to level 2 or above and 86% went on to do a level 1 or below.
  - 40 % of these were base taught - 45% of this went on to level 2 or above and 55% went on to do a level 1 or below.
  - 14% of these were blended - 50% of this went on to level 2 or above and 50% went on to do a level 1 or below.

Other Key groups have been added to the Destinations spreadsheet for next year including FSM's and TAC/CIN/CP however as these key groups are changeable it will be related to their status at point of transition.
