

## Destinations report 2025 leavers

### 54 (not including 1 pupil who have remained at Pilgrim) School leavers

#### Notes

(Details below of individual pupils)

- 86% of pupils have a secured destination within an educational setting this is up by 4% on last academic year.
- 1 more pupil is NEET than previous year with the percentage of pupils who are NEET for this year being 13%. However, as there were more leavers this year the percentage of pupils who are NEET is actually 2% lower than last year.
- 3 of the 6 pupils who are NEET have an EHCP, 1 of which is signed off education for mental health reasons.
- 1 out of the 6 NEET was inpatient and is a forces pupil that moved out of area at the end of October, both factors contributed to a lack of placement being identified.
- 1 out of the 6 NEET is under social care and moved out of area temporally which caused a loss of placement.
- 1 out of the 6 NEET was registered as a Child in Care shortly after leaving Pilgrim.
- The other pupil registered as NEET struggled significantly after Mock exams and had a focus on completing exams rather than transition and therefore decided to take the year off to reset.
- 37% of pupils had an EHCP confirmed (20 pupils)
- 17 out of the 20 (85%) pupils with an EHCP have a confirmed placement.

- There does not appear to be a direct correlation between length of time pupils have been at Pilgrim and successful transition:

Of the 3 pupils who have gone on to complete A-Levels 1 of them attended Pilgrim in KS3 (Base taught), 1 started in year 10 (Blended package), and 1 started while in year 11 (Base taught).

16 of the 47 pupils who secured a placement attended Pilgrim in KS3.

18 of the 47 pupils who secured a placement began Pilgrim in year 10.

13 of the 47 pupils who secured a placement started at Pilgrim in year 11.

Out of the 6 pupils NEET, 2 pupils attended Pilgrim for 3 years or longer (1 signed off medically, and 1 who repeated year 11 at Pilgrim), 4 pupils started attending Pilgrim while in Year 10.

The 1 pending pupil (awaiting a medical assessment for the Royal Air Force) started at Pilgrim in Year 11.

- There has been an increase in the number of pupils accessing a level 2 qualification or higher at 48% (26 of 54). This is 10% higher than last year and the first increase in 4 years.
- There was no uptake on Apprenticeships this year, although 1 pupil is pending Joining the Royal Air Force.
- No pupils went on to employment which was the same as last year.
- There is one pupil this year who was granted online learning opportunities funded by the local authority for their SEND needs.
- There is one pupil this year who has gone on to Elective Home Education again due to their SEND needs.

#### Key Group Breakdown

- Home Pupils = 8 of the 54 pupils are home taught (14%)
  - 50% of these have gone on to complete a level 2 or above level of qualification.
  - 50% of these have gone on to complete a level 1 or below level of qualification.
  - 0% of these are NEET.
- Base Pupils – 39 of the 54 pupils are base taught (72%)
  - 43% of these have gone on to complete a level 2 or above level of qualification.
  - 43% of these have gone on to complete a level 1 or below level of qualification.
  - 10% of these are NEET and 2% pending
- Blended Pupils – 7 of the 54 pupils were blended with a mix of both home and base education (12%)
  - 57% of these have gone on to complete a level 2 or above level of qualification.

14% of these have gone on to complete a level 1 or below level of qualification.

28% of these are NEET.

- EHCP – 20 of the 54 pupils have an EHCP (37%)  
20% of these were home taught (4 pupils) – 50% of this went on to level 2 or above and 50% went on to do a level 1 or below.  
70% of these were base taught (14 pupils) - 14% of this went on to level 2 or above and 71% went on to do a level 1 or below. 14% were NEET.  
10% of these were blended (2 pupils) - 50% of this went on to level 2 or above and 0% went on to do a level 1 or below. 50% was NEET.
- TAC – 6 out of 54 pupils were open to TAC (11%) - 33% went on to complete a level 2 or above qualification, 66% went on to complete a level 1 or below qualification
- CIN – 1 out of 54 pupils were open in CIN (1.85%) - This pupil went on to complete a level 1 or below qualification.
- CP – 0 out of 54 pupils were open to CP (0%)
- CIC – 1 out of 54 pupils were open in CIC (1.85%) - This pupil was NEET
- FSM – 17 out of 54 pupils were entitled to FSM (31%) - 52% went on to complete a level 2 or above qualification, 41% went on to complete a level 1 or below qualification, 5% was NEET
