Chinese food has come top in a poll of Britain's favourite takeaways.

A poll of 2,000 Brits found that Chinese was 'far and away' the top takeaway for Brits, with 35 per cent of the vote.


Indian food came in second, with 24 per cent, with pizza in third spot with 13 per cent.

The survey by Paymentsense, a low cost card payment service, used by more than 50,000 small businesses in the UK also found that most people still call a takeaway to place an order rather then using an app or ordering online.

The poll found that 57 per cent of Brits call up the takeaway to order food to be delivered, with 25 per cent simply walking to the takeaway and 18 per cent booking online or using an app to order food for delivery.

The survey found that the average Brit orders a takeaway at least once a week, with men more likely or order than women - although women spent more than men.

The average amount spent on takeaways in a year came to just over £500.

Gareth Varley, 34, of Hertford, Herts, said: "I usually get at least one takeaway a week - usually an Indian or a Chinese on a Friday night. "If I had money to burn I'd get a takeaway every night, it beats cooking and washing up pots and pans."
